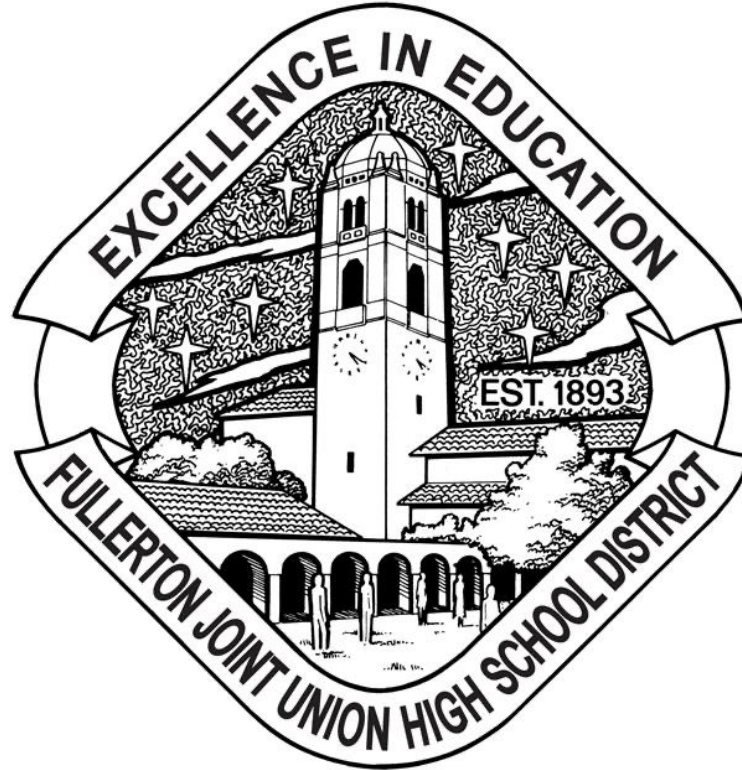

# Uniform Complaint Procedures

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## What is the UCP?

- UCP is a uniform system to process complaints for specified programs or activities that receive state or federal funding. The UCP strives to resolve problems at the local level but allows some issues that have not been resolved to be appealed to the State level.

## Who can file a complaint?

- Any person, public agency, or organization can file a complaint.



# Uniform Complaint Procedures

**Each type of complaint has a different purpose and procedure to file.**

- I. Complaints concerning school personnel
- II. Complaints alleging unlawful discrimination, harassment, intimidation, or bullying, or violations of laws or regulations governing specified district programs or activities
- III. Complaints concerning the requirements for adoption of Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) and pupil fees

**There are two ways to file a complaint:**

1. Informal
2. Formal

# Who Qualifies Under McKinney-Vento?

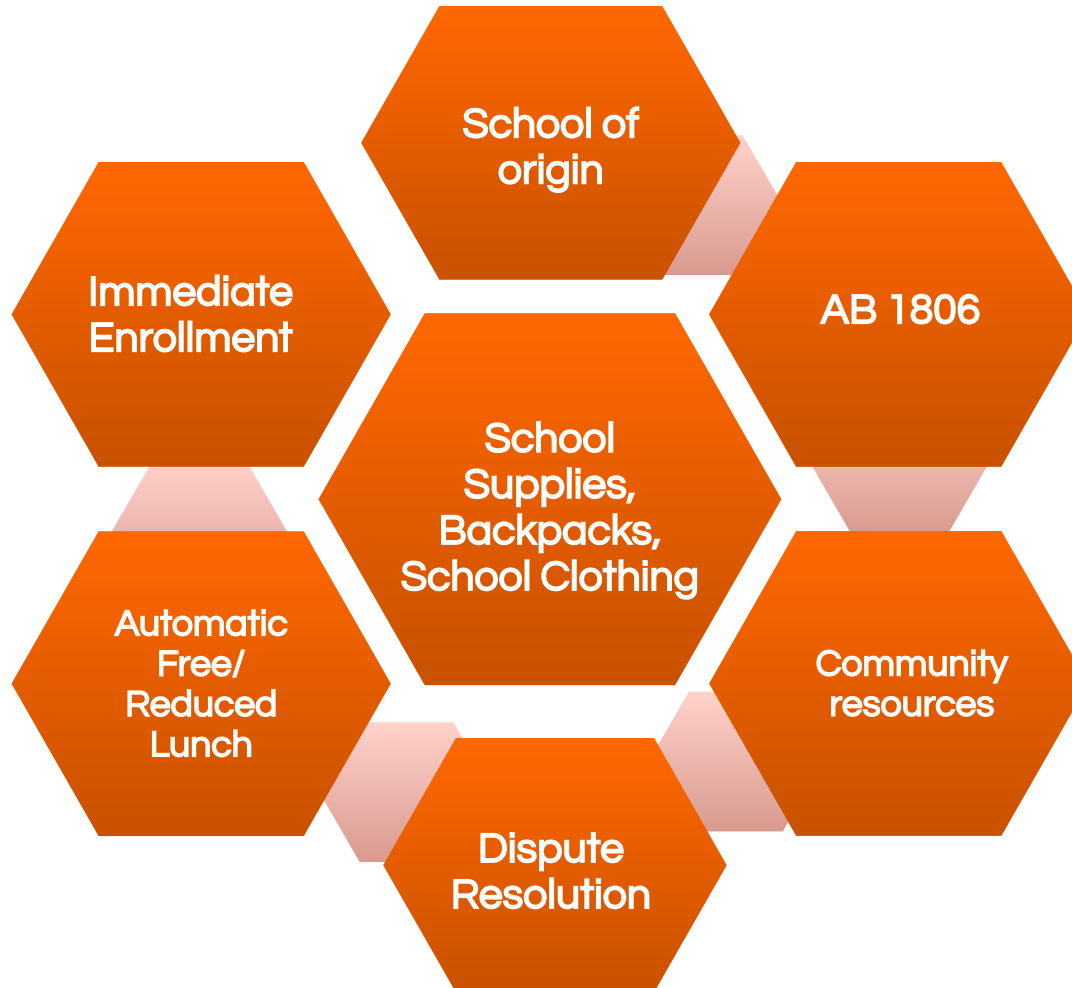
The McKinney-Vento Act defines a "homeless" student as one between 0 to 22 years of age, who lacks a **fixed, regular, and adequate** nighttime residence, and may include:

- Sharing the housing of others due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or similar reason (“doubled up”)
- Living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, camping grounds due to the lack of adequate alternative accommodations
- Living in emergency or transitional shelters
- Living in a public or private place not designed for humans to live
- Living in cars, parks, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or a similar setting
- Abandoned, runaway or pushed-out youth or migratory children living in any of the above circumstances

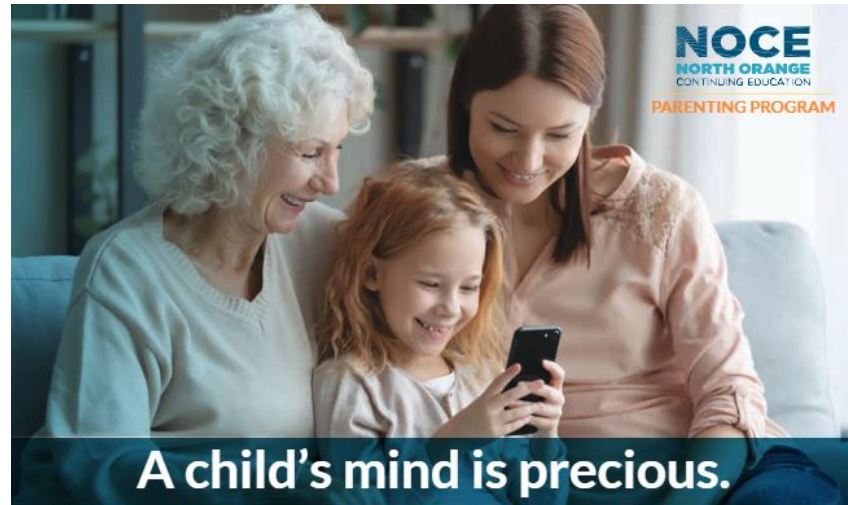
