DECEMBER 2022

December 21: Mercury (Eastern) Elongation & Winter Solstice
Mercury will be at its longest distance from

the sun, which will provide great viewing in the evening sky. Mercury has a bright grayish hue, similar to our moon.

December 21st will be the longest day of the year, and the shortest night.

Mercury Rise and Set Times: Rises at 8:24 AM and Sets at 6:14 PM

Twitch Community Reels After Recent Dramatic Events

September 4th was a reckoning day for much of the Twitch community as members learned of a cheating scandal that occurred within the competitive chess community. What began as simple accusations quickly spiraled into a mess of leaks, scams, and public outings. It all started with the Chess Sinquefeld Cup in September, when rookie Hans Niemann went up against World Chess champion Magnus Carlsen and during the match, Mag-

nus Carlsen resigned and later accused Hans of cheating. The championship was streamed live on Twitch and gained a large audience from the chess community, so the news of this alleged cheating caused minor controversy. A month after the issue he decided to sue several parties for defamation, including Chess.com, played on, Hikaru Nakamura, a well known chess grandmaster who gave his opinion...

Later on in the trip, we were taught about the Watergate scandal. Nixon learned about several Watergate office building break ins. . However, when hearing about this, he opted to try and cover them up rather than report them. He was caught, and eventually, this led to his resignation in 1974.



The tour started with a timeline of President Nixon's political accomplishments, leading to a replica of the Oval Office from Nixon's term as President. Students were delighted to be able to sit in a replica of the chair he used, and even see the phone that was used in his time.

After this, there was an assortment of exhibits encompassing Nixon's presidential career. This ranged from the moon landing to Nixon's visit to China. Abraham Lincoln was even spotted sitting on a bench outside!

This Trial is based on the murder case of Hae Min Lee, whose ex-boyfriend Adnan Syed got sent behind bars. The question is “ If he really did it?

After a month of hard work, 12 long podcasts, research, and studies this sums up to the final round of FPFA Mock Trial. Will the Jury vote on guilty or innocent?

The Aftermath

The information provided by students was well done. Some students even worked together to create skits for their trials. Can’t say if they were good or not, but it’s the work put into it that counts. FPFA Mock Trial in general is 300 points for each individual student. All Stars are extra credit, and it’s much more entertaining, as some may say. For determining winners, voting was done on Dr. York’s Instagram. If you’ve seen previous years, you might have seen a different type of voting, which was a box voting. Although this new form of voting certainly streamlined the voting process, it also led to some audience members spamming the voting by casting votes from multiple accounts.

Update on the Case

The case that was provided during the trial was the murder case of Hae Min Lee. Her ex-boyfriend Adnan Syed was accused of murdering her. Throughout the case, there were suspects and others who took part in talking in this case. Now after all this information you were either convinced Adnan murdered Hae or he didn’t. Truth is, no one knows who really killed Hae Min Lee till this day.

In 2016 Adnan’s attorney introduced new evidence. In 2019 the highest court in Maryland reserved a decision to give Ad-

nan a new trial. On October 11 Baltimore prosecutors dropped the charges against Adnan Syed. Adnan spent 23 years fighting charges and finally got released this year in October. Although he was finally free, it is said by prosecutors that “ were not asserting that Mr. Syed was innocent-...”

Now what, you may ask? There’s still more years of trials to come along. Who knows if FPFA will still use this case because of the updated circumstances of the case. Whether you think the All Stars Mock Trial was to your liking or not, applaud the ones who participated and tried their hardest throughout this time. Safe Driving By Allie Valentine

A part of growing up during your high school years is starting to learn how to drive but more importantly young teens need to learn and practice safe driving. Reckless driving causes about 33% of deaths each year so it is very important to make sure we are driving aware, alert and careful.

Driving Under the Influence

In the state of California, it is illegal to operate a vehicle with a BAC (blood alcohol concentration) of 0.08%. It is illegal for minors up till age 21 to consume alcohol at all. There is a death due to an alcohol impaired driver every 50 minutes.

That is about 30 humans a day losing their lives from a preventable situation made from the decisions of others. There has been a 14% increase of impaired driving deaths since 2019.

15% of alcohol impaired drivers involved in fatal collisions are between the ages of 16-20, 27% are ages 21-24, and 25% are ages 25-34. Take a look at the chart for further data.

This data proves why it is so important to make sure you are practicing safe driving at all times. Not just for yourself but the people around you as well. One decision can make the difference of someone or yourself losing a life.

How Alcohol Affects Driving Skills

When one is under the influence of alcohol it dulls part of your brain which will impair one’s decision making skill and coordination.

When you consume alcohol, it becomes a depressant of your CNS (central nervous system) causing the brain to slow down the release of nerve impulses. This will also result in one’s mental state to become unstable leading to get easily overwhelmed with happiness and euphoria and/or easily saddened

Preventative Measures

The most obvious prevention is simply not to drink and drive under any circumstance. By

drinking and driving you are putting your own life and the peoples around you at a huge risk.

A legal consequence of drinking and driving is a fine that could be up to \$10,000, jail time, and/or license suspension or revocation.

Though it is easy to make decisions for yourself, you can’t decide what others do. Knowing this when driving you should be alert of your surroundings at all times to keep yourself and any passengers safe.

If you are in a situation where your driver or a driver you know is under the influence you should never get in the car to drive with them. Encourage them not to drive and call 911 in a necessary situation.

To protect yourself at all times from a drunk driver on the road is to properly secure your seatbelt. Just a seatbelt has proven to reduce the likelihood of the crash being fatal.

Celestial Events for the Months of December and January

(Continued from the front page) What Mercury will look like on December 21st, 5:15 PM (Looking South-West South)



December 22nd: Ursids Meteor Shower
The Ursids is a minor meteor shower that happens in the Constellation of “Ursa Major”. Its peak will begin on the morning of December 22, 2022. During the peak, there will be about 150 meteors per hour on the peak.

Make sure to look for these events in the sky this month, and happy Star-Gazing. More Information: <https://skyandtelescope.org/>

JANUARY 2023

January 3rd and 4th, 2023: Quadrantids Meteor Shower

The Quadrantids is an above average shower, with up to 40 meteors per hour at its peak. It peaks this year on the night of the 3rd and morning of the 4th. This year the nearly full moon will block out most of the fainter meteors. But if you are patient you may still be able to catch a few good ones. Best viewing will be from a dark location after midnight. Meteors will radiate from the constellation Bootes, but can appear anywhere in the sky.



January 6th, 2023: Full Moon

This full moon was known by early Native American tribes as the Wolf Moon because this was the time of year when hungry

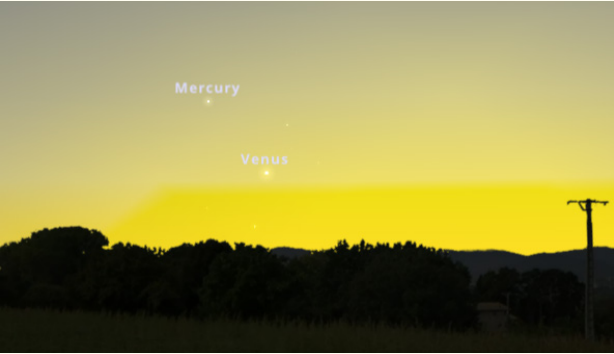
wolf packs howled outside their camps. This moon has also been known as the Old Moon and the Moon After Yule.

January 21st, 2023: New Moon

The Moon will be located on the same side of the Earth as the Sun and will not be visible in the night sky. This is the best time of the month to observe faint objects such as galaxies and star clusters because there is no moonlight to interfere.

January 30th, 2023: Mercury (Western) Elongation

The planet Mercury reaches greatest western elongation of 25 degrees from the Sun. This is the best time to view Mercury since it will be at its highest point above the horizon in the morning sky. Look for the planet low in the eastern sky just before sunrise.

(continued from the front page) on the matter, and his opponent Magnus Carlson.

However, the chess community wasn’t the only one to have its play with drama. The gambling community was also another to be in the line of fire. A popular streamer called Sliker was exposed of scamming on September 17th for a total of \$300,000 and it has been brought to light that he has a gambling addiction.

Gambling on Twitch has been a viewed factor of interest for a long time now and there have been multiple unreported cases of scams but not to the level of what Sliker has done. He asked various streamers, friends, and content creators for money which he would then gamble away live on Twitch or just gamble away off camera which he would eventually lose. He continued this cycle until a web of lies became too thick to not notice and until he had scammed a large amount of money. And on October 18th, Twitch decided to ultimately ban gambling for content on their platform.

The victims were fortunately paid back by other popular content creators such as

Ludwig and xQc in full and the \$300,000 worth of debt was erased. Sliker however, was banned from Twitch and is in search of mental health on his gambling addiction.

The scandals and scamming weren’t the end of it though. Before Twitch banned gambling, many content creators voiced their opinions strongly on media such as Twitter. Many advocated for the banning of streamed gambling on Twitch including popular streamer Mizkif. He had defended a friend that voiced his opinion about Sliker being banned off of Twitch which was met with some backlash by a content creator named Trainwreck. Mizkif had essentially brought up old scars for Trainwreck because he was guilty of scamming that he had done in the past. Trainwreck replied with a bombshell that broke the Twitch community

Mizkif was accused of having covered up allegations of sexual assault against his friend named Slick. The victim’s name was Adrianah Lee and she had voiced what had happened but her voice was drowned out by the fans of Mizkif and fans of fellow con-

tent creators of his.

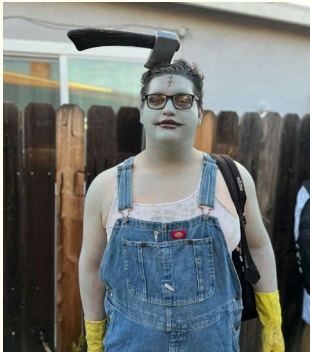

Imagine yourself walking along the edge of a pond one dark and eerily quiet night when suddenly you hear a woman cry, “¿Dónde estan mis hijos?” You whip around and see a woman in white with her face covered and she points at you as she repeats “¿Dónde estan mis hijos?” Who is this weeping woman you’ve come across?

Many young kids of Mexican culture have all heard of La Llorona, or the weeping women. Whether they had first-hand experiences or heard it from someone else they know, everyone has a story.

There are many versions of her story, ranging from her husband cheating on her to being difficult and her husband leaving her with their two children. Whichever version, it is always stated that she was filled with so much grief over her husband, that while she was on a walk with her children, she shoved them into the water. She was filled with so much guilt after doing that, she walked along streams crying out for her children hoping they would come back to her.

Although sightings of her have been

more reported throughout Mexico, those people have brought sightings to either their children or their family. Even if they haven’t seen her for themselves, stories of her have been passed around from family to family. They all say that they see a woman wet with no facial expressions yet they can hear her crying.

Yet in popular culture, she’s become a song that’s very catchy and has many different versions that range from pop and slow. In fact, the choir at LHHS sang a rendition of the classic “La Llorona” song written for them by composer Dr. Soto.

There are also different movie variations of her story, ranging from animated to live-action. One of the greatest movies made about La Llorona has a different twist to it but still has a haunting feeling as the curse itself. Guatemalan filmmaker Jayro Bustamante, his movie *La Llorona* uses the myth and uses it to tell a political drama set in Guatemala in the 1980s. This movie has enough horror and grit to keep the audience entertained.

My father would tell me about his en-

counter with La Llorona which will send chills down the spines of the readers:

When Carlo was young he had a babysitter that would tell him the legend of La Llorona. How she would take children away and he had to be careful. In order to avoid her kidnapping him, the babysitter would tell him every night to put a peso (Mexican currency) on his window seal. Each morning, the peso would be gone.

“I was so surprised whenever it was gone. It scared me! As I got older I think I finally realized that she was robbing me...” He said, ashamed.

Beware of La Llorona and babysitters’ stories.

So next time you’re out for a late-night walk by yourself and you find the evening to be particularly dark and eerily silent, you too will hear the cries of La Llorona before realizing that you might be next!

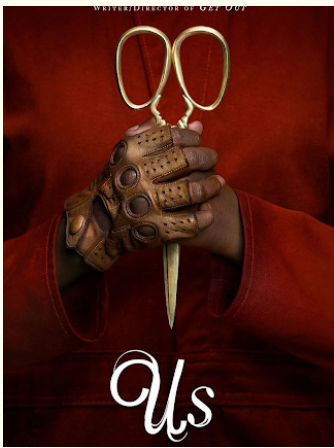

Junior Kandace Curtis is grateful for her job! She loves working with her friends and feels “it’s a great opportunity to get out into the world.”v



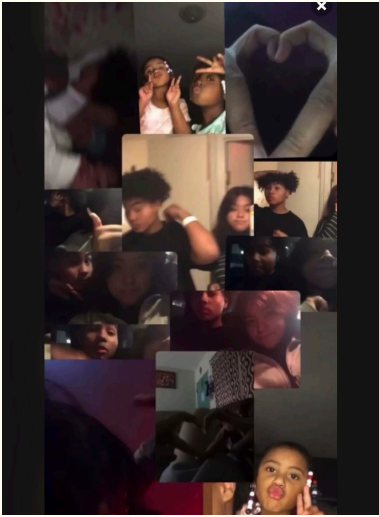
The thankful energy is sure to prevail throughout La Habra during this holiday season, and it’s important to remember the things in our lives that make life great.

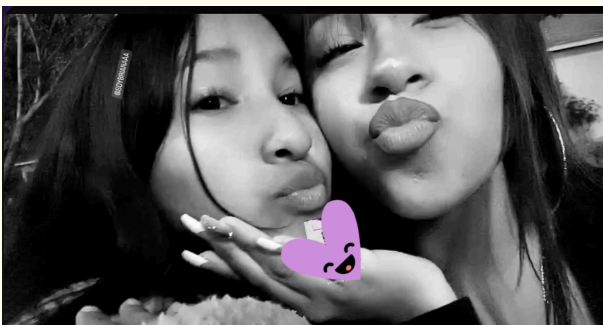


me feel like I’m any less of a person. My family has always been there to support me so I’m always grateful for them.” Natalie’s words have shown that family is the most important thing in life and with-

Faith: All I do is just eat and go to sleep, so it’s really not that important

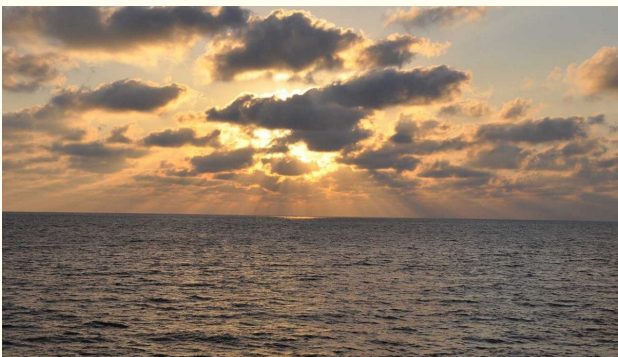
LeAnn: Thanksgiving isn’t important, it is really a useless holiday.

What the players actually got was something unexpected. Legacy

players who had the first game had the luxury of utilizing all the heroes that were in the first game and *Overwatch 2* beta, but not the newest hero, Kiriko.

Newer players however, only had a set amount of heroes they could play while the rest were locked by some progressive system that has yet to be implemented yet. A PVE game mode, a mode where you fight against AI was also promised but not at the launch of the game. In terms of maps there were only half of what *Overwatch 1* had and they even re-used some older maps so in reality you were simply playing *Overwatch 1* with the same heroes and maps. There are quality of life changes, balance changes, and user interface changes but hardly enough to really call it *Overwatch 2*.

In closing, Blizzard Entertainment has brought back many who feel nostalgic about *Overwatch 1* with many character reworks which breathe some life into the game, but ultimately, there was not enough content to warrant a sequel and they simply made cosmetics and characters more expensive. *Overwatch 2* is simply just..a cash grab.

Art supplies are relatively expensive. Sometimes you can find bargains for good supplies, but not in these craft stores. You can find art supplies at Micheal's or, shamelessly, Hobby Lobby. There are also cheaper dollar stores that surprisingly have good ones. It's like buried treasure trying to find good supplies.

The popularity of art supplies increased more when social media became accessible. Personally, I see copic markers used a lot in the art communities. Copic markers were made in 1987 and are professional markers that are smooth markers that come in a wide range of colors. Copes have a popular brand you can buy from. The more com-

mon copic brands are Copic® and Ohuhu markers. A suggestion is to actually try out other copic marker brands. There are some excellent ones that are cheaper.

Another popular art supply is colored pencils, but want to upgrade it more to a better color pencil? Prisma color pencils originated in 1938. Prismas contain graphite, clay, and binders. Prisma colors help blend more and are pretty fun to use. It helps a lot with details. However,

it's expensive, just like the Copic® marker brand. In online research, one pencil can range from \$2-6. That is expensive, but for the ways it works in art works, it's worth it. This can be accessed from Micheal's, Target, Walmart, and Hobby Lobby. There are some cheaper packs in Target.

Now there's definitely more supplies to look at, but every artist needs a canvas. To be more literal,

a sketchbook. There are actually a lot of good sketchbooks. Personally, I see a lot of people use the Mixed Media XL sketchbooks. They work really well for a variety of supplies.
