Since Tuesday, we have had a full week of CIF playoffs, the Spring season of athletics beginning, with Boys' Volleyball, Baseball, Softball, Boys' Golf, Track & Field, and Swim already in full swing, swim, run, and jump. All of our academic classes, especially those with external competency examinations such as AP, IB, & Cambridge have testing dates getting closer and those examinations begin in April. CAASPP testing will be the second week after Spring Break, on March 31st, so that will be our testing warm-up for our 11th graders. Get used to being busy! As we move through our Spring semester, and towards the end of the school year, the perception is that time only speeds up. This week in athletics, our Girls' Water Polo team in CIF Semi-Finals vs. Yucaipa High School won a playoff game for the ages. Last Friday night at Fullerton Stadium our Girls' Soccer team played at home on in the 2nd round against Etiwanda High School. We were just a day short of our soccer field at Troy from being playable due to all the rain the two prior days. In what was a very intense game, our team won this game 1-0 on a goal scored in the first half by Erin Perry. This win earned our team a place in the Quarter Finals vs. Los Alamitos High School on Tuesday. As it turned out this match would rival the intensity of our Girls' Water Polo team in their Semi Final. Both teams were very evenly matched and it was a hard fought game through the first and into the second half with the game remaining locked in a 0-0 tie. Late in the second half there was a penalty called against Troy that resulted in a penalty kick for Los Alamitos. Troy goalkeeper Ava De Leest made an amazing stop to deny the goal. The second half continued and the game ended in a 0-0 tie. In the overtime, after playing two 10 minute periods the game was still tied at 0-0. The game went to Penalty Kicks (PK) with each team having five chances. As the PK's began Troy was able to convert one of our first chances. Troy's goalie Ava De Leest stopped Los Alamitos' first PK shot. Then she stopped their second PK, their third PK, their fourth PK. Troy scored a second PK going up 2-0. Los Alamitos could no longer win mathematically win the game and that was it! 




