Occasionally, I will get some info on an alum on what they are currently doing or have achieved enroute to where they are in their lives. Here is some info recently shared by the mother of one of our graduates, Elizabeth Shum Class of 2023!

"I have great news to share with you. Our oldest daughter, Troy Tech/IB alumni was accepted at Cornell University at the age of 19, for law school starting this fall. She graduated

with top honors from Troy (2023), NHS and CSF member, being the IB student of the year (2023), National merit finalist. She was accepted for undergrad to NYU Stern of business school, USC with a presidential award (50% tuition for 4 years) and decided on UCI because she liked the program and she knew she could graduate sooner. Currently attending UCI, she transferred 111 credits from AP/IB from Troy plus 10 more credits from summer classes at UC Berkeley and John Hopkins while being a high school student. Total of 121 credits, needing 180 to graduate with her BA Business degree, which she completed in 18 months. At this moment she is doing a minor in humanities to stay at UCI for 2 years. Now heading for Grad school!

While at UCI she is still a 4.0 student and this second year, as a Senior, she has been working for UCI as a Student peer counselor helping students to map down their careers. She took her LSAT as a freshman (18 years) and accepted at 19 years of age for law school. It just so impressive as most law students take their LSAT as real seniors (4th year college) and work in a law firm for 1-2 years before being accepted in law school.

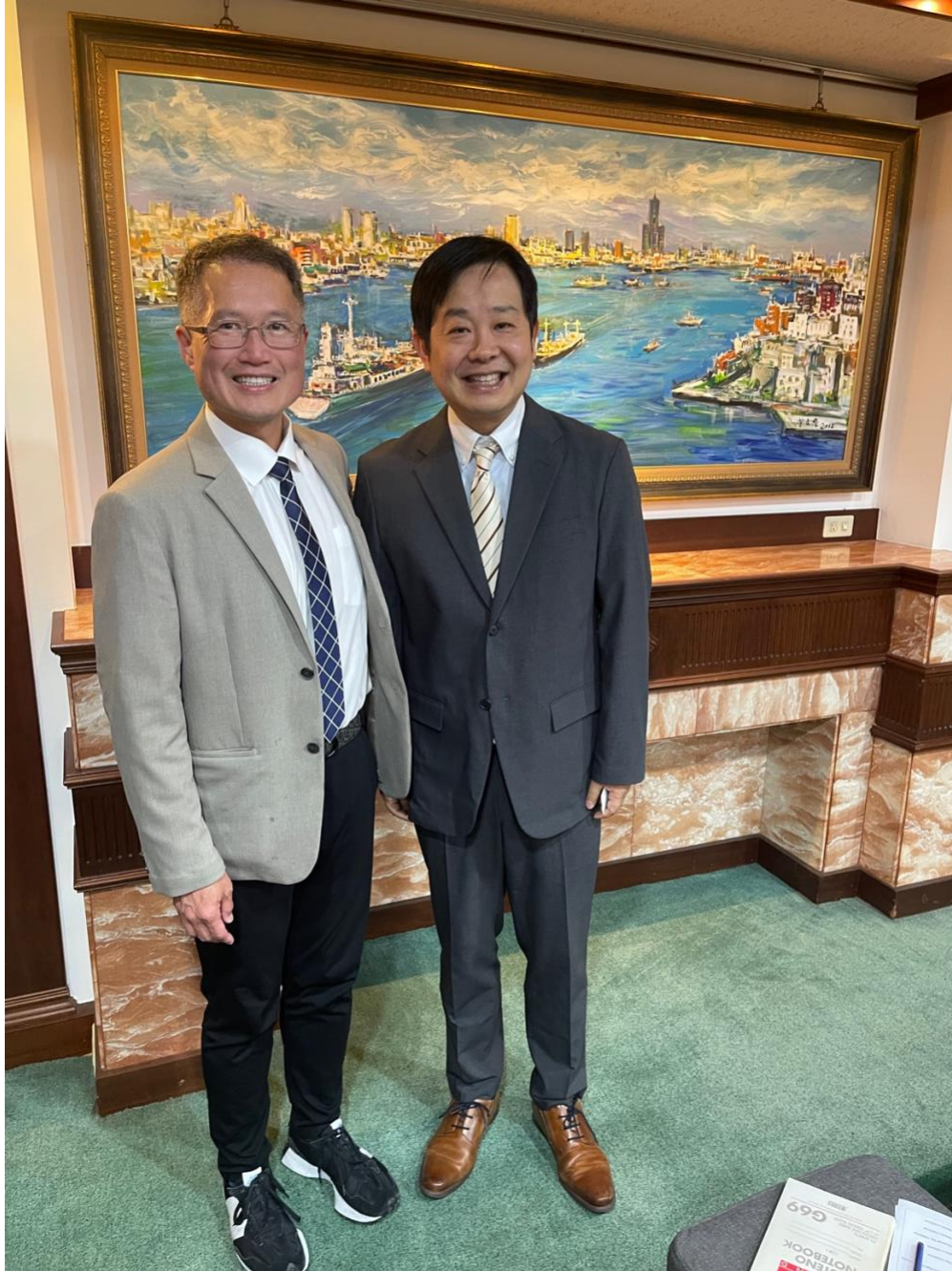
