



I'm so proud of our team for collaborating on all fronts and selflessly giving your time to make Troy a better community and example to inspire others. Thank you for all that you do. When we return from Spring Break we will have a different school schedule for two weeks as we conduct our annual California State Assessments. 11th grade students will take exams in Mathematics, English, and Science. These scores are important to our students and our school, and they help support the grades our students have earned throughout the years and which are posted on their transcripts. Additionally, the State of California has begun to put more

emphasis on the importance of these exams (CAASPP) for other recognitions such as California Distinguished School and the State Seal of Biliteracy. The Seal of Biliteracy includes a provision that students must meet or exceed the standards for English on the CAASPP exam in order to receive the Seal of Biliteracy on their diploma. This year the Science scores will count and be reported for the first time. For Troy with our Troy Tech Magnet program and our National Champion Science Olympiad Teams, it would be an accurate reflection of our school if we end up being the #1 Science school in California as measured by the CAASPP. It will be reflected on the California State High School Dashboard, and will further support what our students know. Please do your best on these exams and know you are benefitting yourselves and Troy High School by performing to your very best! Thank you, and go Warriors!
