
If students can't attend live, they can access recordings of the sessions both on <u>YouTube</u> and in <u>AP Classroom</u>. AP teachers will have the option to assign the recorded review videos through AP Classroom to whole class sections, groups of students, or individual students. All review videos can be found on the Review tab in AP Classroom, under Course Resources. Assigning the review videos is just like assigning AP Daily videos.

AP students can also utilize the <u>free resources</u> in AP Classroom to help them check their understanding of content and skills, as well as get quick feedback on their areas of strength and where they may need more practice.

This week and next, please encourage your AP students to join AP Daily teachers as they provide live review and practice for the upcoming AP Exams!



Dear FJUHSD Staff Members, Students and Parents/Guardians,

Happy Friday! As we look forward to the end of another successful school year, the District is busy making plans for next year. In doing so, we would like to take this opportunity to remind staff members, students, and parents/guardians that beginning with the 2022/23 school year, all schools will start at 8:30 a.m. in order to meet the new requirement in California.

On October 13, 2019, Governor Gavin Newsom signed Senate Bill 328, Pupil Attendance: School Start Time. SB 328 requires that the school day for middle schools begins no earlier than 8:00 a.m. and the school day for high schools begins no earlier than 8:30 a.m. The start times will go into effect on July 1, 2022. SB 328 does not include zero periods.

District administrators have been working with site administrators and staff members to plan and develop bell schedules for the 2022/23 school year that will reflect this new start time. Specific information regarding each school sites' bell schedules will be provided in the very near future from your site teams.

Thank you for your continued partnership. We hope everyone has a wonderful weekend, and for those who choose, we look forward to seeing your smiling faces on Monday.
