Your school has earned the College Board AP Computer Science Female Diversity Award for attaining female student representation in AP Computer Science Principles for 2018. Among the more than 18,000 secondary schools worldwide that offer AP courses, yours is **one of only 685** that have achieved this important result."

To put an exclamation point on this recognition from the College Board, on Tuesday, Troy Cyber Teacher/Coach, Mr. Allen Stubblefield wrote: "We have qualified for an online Nationals cyber defense competition on June 5-7. Our team of 4 will be junior Jen Ho, sophomore Katrina Mizou, freshman Crystal Lee, freshman Shirley Jia will be representing Troy for this first ever Girls Go CyberStart Nationals competition. This team is representing the larger team of 15 Troy females who last week won \$500 for being in 3rd place in California in an earlier phase of the same competition." Congratulations, Warriors!
