#### Dear FJUHSD Staff Members and Community Members:

As we complete eight weeks of distance learning in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, I would like to acknowledge all the hard work and dedication of everyone in our school community. Teachers, students and parents have been working together to develop a new educational environment using online learning and video conferencing. Thank you for your trust and patience as we work together to navigate this constantly changing situation.

Although our buildings are physically closed, school is happening virtually at home. We know this time has been especially tough on our most needy families, including many who are living in difficult conditions. Our teachers are working more than ever to connect with students emotionally during these traumatic times while still ensuring learning takes place.

This has also been a difficult time for our high school seniors who have worked hard and achieved so much in their educational career. Many of us are parents and we feel the pain and disappointment in not being able to share in the celebratory events associated with a student's senior year. It is important we all recognize and congratulate our seniors.

During a press conference on April 28, Governor Newsom discussed "with cautious optimism" the possibility of schools reopening for the 2020-21 school year starting this summer. On April 29, State Superintendent Tony Thurmond issued a statement about his intent to explore the possibility of California schools starting earlier with state and national leaders. At this time, we do not anticipate an earlier start date in FJUHSD. Currently, FJUHSD's start date for the 2020-21 school year is August 11, 2020. This date is already early compared to many school districts. The District will continue to monitor this situation. Additional guidance for schools will be coming from the Governor's office in the following days. As we have more information, we will provide updates to our community.

During the month of May, we are pleased to have the opportunity to celebrate and honor our FJUHSD employees!

This week, May 4 through May 8 is Teacher Appreciation Week, which recognizes teachers and certificated staff for their dedication, talent, and compassion. Our teachers and certificated staff members have gone above and beyond in helping our students shift from classroom instruction to distance learning. #### **Other Reminders**

• AP Exam Demo (available May 4): AP students should use the clickable exam demo to practice the different ways to submit their exam responses. The demo will help students confirm that their testing device will be able to access and run the online exam. If they can't access the demo, the final slide of the Testing Guide can help them troubleshoot. The sample content in the demo will be the same for all users and isn't a practice exam. We'll send educators and students an email to remind them when the demo is available. Please encourage your students to take this important preparation step.

Information for AP Chinese, French, German, Italian, Japanese, and Spanish Language and Culture Exams:

- The above exams will be administered using a new dedicated app, the AP World Languages Exam App. Students taking these exams must use this app on smartphones or tablets. This free app will be available for download from the Apple App Store and Google Play Store the week of May 11. We'll email students and their teachers to let them know when the app is available to download. Visit <u>our site</u> for more details.
- A video walk-through of the test-taking experience will be available the week of May 4.
- Details on accommodations for the above exams are also <u>now available</u>.
- If your students are unsure about accessing the app, or if they don't have a device, they can fill out <u>this survey</u> (or you can complete it on their behalf) as soon as possible so we can help support them (applicable to U.S. and U.S. territories).
- Information for AP Music Theory Exams:
- Before exam day, students will need to print or hand-copy the 2020 Music Theory Answer Sheet and gain access to an audio recording app or software before exam day.

"Congratulations, your school has qualified for the National Championship! Girls Go CyberStart is a girls-only capture-the-flag competition, where girls from across the country solve challenges in areas such as reverse-engineering, cryptography, Linux, and web attacks. When solved, players get a flag, which is a string that is exchanged for points. The more points a team has, the higher ranked they are. Teams across the nation are selected for the Nationals competition based on their points. The competition will happen across two days (Wednesday, May 20-Thursday, May 21). Our G-TEC club has qualified for the Girls Go Cyberstart Nationals! Competing for our school will be sophomores Ashmita Kumar, Shirley Jia, Amber Wang, and freshman Cheryl Wang."
