At orientation, students will turn in their emergency card, take their yearbook photo, receive their list of classes, check out textbooks, get their locker, meet with their counselor, and make purchases at the activities office (ASB card, yearbook, dance tickets, etc.).

All families will receive a follow up email late next week with instructions for completing online data confirmation, which must be done for all students prior to orientation. With that email will also be each student's specific time to report for orientation.
